Resolution in Support of Continued Participation in Northeastern Pennsylvania Regional Wide Area Network

WHEREAS Luzerne Intermediate Unit 18, Northeastern Educational Intermediate Unit 19 ("Intermediate Units") and participating school districts and career and technology centers ("Schools") located in the areas served by these intermediate units established the Northeastern Pennsylvania Regional Wide Area Network in 2006 in order to interconnect with one another and/or to obtain cost-effective Internet access service; and

WHEREAS, the fiber wide area network circuits that interconnect the Schools and the internet service must be competitively bid to qualify for E-rate discount funding to offset the costs of these services; and

WHEREAS, the fiber wide area network circuit and internet master service agreements were competitively bid most recently in 2015, and the existing master service agreements expire in June 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Intermediate Units in consultation with the Schools conducted a competitive procurement beginning in the summer of 2020 and which culminated in the second week of February when the most-cost effective vendors were chosen for the fiber wide area network circuit and internet services; and

WHEREAS, in order for the IUs to be able to execute master service agreements on behalf of the Schools, the IUs need each School's assurance they will pay for their respective costs of the services; and

WHEREAS, the IUs have prepared RWAN Service Orders for each School to review and sign.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Board of Directors approves the continued participation in the NEPA RWAN in accordance with the Service Agreement and E-rate Letter of Agency to be effective through June 30, 2026, or if the master service agreements are extended the School may decide to continue to participate in the NEPA RWAN through June 30, 2028.
- 2. The Board of Directors agrees and authorizes the IUs to enter into master service agreements with the most cost-effective service providers for fiber circuit wide area network and internet access services on behalf of this School and agrees to pay for their respective services in accordance with the terms of the Regional Wide Area Network Service Order.
- 3. The Board of Directors approves the execution of the Regional Wide Area Network Service Order and E-rate Letter of Agency to be in effect for the initial term through June 30, 2026 or if extended, through June 30, 2028.

NOW THEREFORE, School Customer agrees as follows:

- 1. School Customer approves the execution of master service agreements with commercial service providers to be signed by LIU 18 and NEIU on behalf of School Customer, and that will provide the following services to for the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2026 and subject to voluntary extensions through June 30, 2028 (see Section 7 below).
 - A. Wide Area Network Service: 10 Gbps lit fiber wide area network service to interconnect with all other School Customers at a cost of \$1,788.33 per month or \$21,459.95 per year (prior to the reflection of E-rate discount funding).
 - B. Internet Access Service: 10 Gbps Internet at a cost of \$735.30 per month or \$8823.60 per year for (prior to the reflection of E-rate discount funding).
- 2. School Customer agrees to pay for RWAN Management and Administrative Services such as network operations and related support, invoice processing, accounts payable and receivable, project management and administration, network operations and related support at a cost not to exceed \$200.00 per month or \$2,400.00 per year. (This fee is not eligible for E-rate discounts).
- 3. School Customer agrees to pay for a proportionate share of the **E-rate consulting service fee of** \$120.00 per month or \$1,440.00 per year that LIU 18 and NEIU will incur. (This fee is not eligible for E-rate discounts).
- 4. School Customer agrees to pay for a proportionate share of the RWAN Distributed Denial of Service (DDoS) Mitigation at a cost not to exceed \$50.00 per month or \$600.00 per year that LIU 18 and NEIU will incur from a supporting vendor. (This fee is not eligible for E-rate discounts).
- 5. School Customer agrees to pay for **RWAN Equipment** such as network switches and related core hardware, at a cost not to exceed **\$100.00 per month** or \$1,200.00 per year. (This fee is net of E-rate discount funding).
- 6. School Customer acknowledges that prior to the second year and each subsequent year that this Service Order is in effect, the fees for RWAN Management and Administrative Services, E-rate consulting services, DDoS Mitigation as set forth above in Items 2, 3 and 4 above will be reviewed annually and adjusted based on actual costs incurred.
- 7. The initial term of this Service Order will begin on July 1, 2021 and continue through June 30, 2026. LIU 18 and NEIU in consultation with School Customer, may extend the master agreements with the commercial service providers through June 30, 2028. In that event this Service Order will automatically be extended through June 30, 2028 unless School Customer notifies LIU 18 and NEIU by January 1, 2026 that the School Customer will terminate this Service Order as of June 30, 2026.
- 8. School Customer acknowledges and understands that LIU 18 and NEIU will execute master service agreements with commercial service providers to facilitate the School Customer's receipt of the services at the prices set forth above in Item 1A through 1B; and, in order to do so, LIU 18 and NEIU are bound to pay the charges incurred to the service providers. In the event that School Customer seeks to voluntarily terminate this Regional Wide Area Service Network Service Order prior to the end of the five (5) year term or any voluntary extension period, School Customer agrees to pay for any early termination charges imposed by the commercial service provider(s) and the balance of the RWAN Management and Administrative Services fee, E-rate consulting fee, and network monitoring contract fee for the year in which the School Customer terminates the Service Order.

- 9. This Service Order does not take effect unless and until LIU 18 and NEIU execute the necessary master service agreements with commercial service providers to facilitate the provision of the wide area network and Internet access services. The prices set forth above are contingent on realizing aggregated cost savings arising from the combined participation of various schools in this procurement. To the extent that fewer than the anticipated number of School Customers may opt to participate in this procurement, LIU 18 and NEIU reserve the right to increase the prices set forth herein subject to School Customer's approval of the revised prices.
- 10. The use of the RWAN Services shall comply with E-rate program requirements and shall not be used for a purpose that is not authorized by the E-rate program.
- 11. School Customer authorizes LIU 18 and NEIU to apply for E-rate funding on behalf of the School Customer for the costs of the E-rate eligible services and equipment as set forth in Section 1. The School Customer will receive an annual credit or reimbursement for the E-rate discount share of the costs paid for E-rate eligible services pursuant to this Service Order. School Customer agrees to respond promptly to all information and document requests from LIU 18 and NEIU pertaining to the E-rate application and funding process. The School Customer is responsible for submitting E-rate applications for all other services and equipment purchased and used by the District or CTC.
- This Service Order constitutes the entire agreement between the School Customer, LIU 18 and NEIU. All prior written and oral understandings between the parties are merged into this Service Order. No agent, representative, employee or officer of the School Customer or of either Luzerne Intermediate Unit 18 and Northeastern Educational Intermediate Unit 19 has authority to make, or has made, any statement, agreement or representation, oral or written, in connection with this Service Order which in any way is deemed to modify, add to, or detract from or otherwise change or alter the terms and conditions of this Service Order.
